PROGRAM COSTS

Each of the four required courses is expected to cost about \$950. Textbooks for each course cost about \$100.



ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To enroll in the Project Management Certificate program you must meet at least one of the following requirements:

- Junior standing at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside or another university.
- An undergraduate degree.
- Associate degree and one year of business experience preferably at midlevel management or above or at an entrepreneurial firm.
- Three years of business experience, preferably at midlevel management or above or at an entrepreneurial firm.

COURSE INFORMATION

To obtain the Project Management Certificate, you must complete all the four courses listed below. You need to receive a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 (C average).

PMGT 341 Basics of Project Management
(3 credits)

PMGT 342 Essential Personal Skills for Project Management
(3 credits)

PMGT 441 Advanced Project Management Tools and Techniques
(3 credits)

PMGT 441 Project Management Simulation
(3 credits)

These courses will help you prepare for the Project Management Professional certification exam offered by the prestigious Project Management Institute (PMI). They cover the Project Management Breadth of Knowledge (PMBok) material emphasized by the PMI.

COURSE LISTING

PMGT 341 – Basics of Project Management:

This course covers PMBoK (Project Management Breadth of Knowledge) in detail. The topics include: project lifecycle; project time management; cost management; human resource management; project communication management; risk management; and procurement management.

PMGT 342 – Essential Personal Skills for Project Management:

This course provides students with a background in personal skills essential for effective project management. Content areas include: Nature of project management; general intelligence; emotional intelligence; groups & teams; project leadership; stress; ethics in project management; and communication.

PMGT 441 – Advanced Project Management Tools and Techniques:

This course is a follow up to PMGT 341, and builds on the PMBoK topics. Using Microsoft Project and Microsoft Excel, advanced tools and techniques of PM will be covered. The techniques include: Work Breakdown Structure (WBS), budgeting a project, scheduling a project using PERT/CPM, allocating scarce resources, critical chain and critical path, resource leveling, monitoring the project costs, evaluating, and terminating a project.

PMGT 442 – Project Management Simulation:

Apply project management skills to a simulated or live project. Develop project justification and project plan. Execute the project plan and track performance. Topics include project scheduling, risk analysis, earned value, and teamwork.

Declaring a Certificate

To declare a Certificate in Project Management, students must submit an application to the Advising Center (Wyllie Hall 107) or the Department of Business Office (Molinaro Hall 344).

Graduate Requirements

To graduate with a Certificate in Project Management, a student must:

- Complete the required program of courses outlined inside.
- Earn a minimum overall GPA of 2.0 for the required course.
