**LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT**

### ❖SPOTLIGHT ON MEMBERS❖

❖Meg Andrietsch was elected an Obama pledged delegate and attended the Democratic National Convention in Denver. Here are her highlights:

"In August, invitations to DNC related events started arriving. I tried to keep track of them all and realized I had 17 events possible for Tuesday of convention week.

Convention activities started on Sunday with caucuses and a New Orleans tribute themed party.

Monday through Thursday we had a mandatory breakfast meeting for the entire Wisconsin delegation. We had to be there to get our credentials for the day – no exceptions, no excuses. Speakers we heard were Gov. Doyle, Sen. Kohl and Feingold, Alabama Gov. Siegelman, Ann Richard's daughter Cecile, Congressional Reps. Tammy Baldwin and Gwen Moore – who got the only standing ovation of the week.

After breakfast we all went our separate ways to meetings and caucuses. Shuttle buses took us to the Pepsi Center where we had to go through Secret Service metal detectors and show our credentials over and over. Finally, I was INSIDE the Pepsi Center and seated in the Wisconsin delegation area. I'm proud to say I was at the sessions every day from opening to closing – 3pm to 9pm.

We could see the CBS booth with Katie Couric and the CNN booth with Wolf Blitzer, Anderson Cooper and other reporters. It was fun to spot a political celebrity. Once inside the Pepsi Center, you could walk around and approach anyone and chat.

We were all moved by Ted Kennedy and inspired by Michelle Obama. We had rally signs for all the major speakers, and we cheered wildly for both Rep Tammy Baldwin and Gov Doyle when they addressed the convention. We loved hearing from Joe Biden and his family and were thrilled when Barack Obama made a surprise appearance.

One interesting feature was the ability to use our phones to text the Obama team and get an updated list of speakers, hour by hour. We did a LOT of texting and e-mailing from inside the Pepsi Center.

Going home each night was an adventure. The buses were there but very crowded and it took about 2 hours to get back to the hotel, where I grabbed a cab to the friend's house where I was staying. I told myself to sleep hard for 6 hours but couldn't close my eyes until around 2. 4 hours of sleep isn't enough.

I had a fun day on Tuesday. The reporter for the Racine newspaper, Bridget Thoreson, was my shadow for the day. We met after breakfast (press not allowed in), and we spent the day going to caucuses, to the Pepsi Center (where she took my picture for the article in the paper), and texting and emailing during the convention. Delegates had their own area, as did the press. She wrote a nice story about 'a day in the life of a delegate'. It's on the Journal Times website, if you use the search box and Andrietsch.

I now know why people go to convention without being a delegate. There are lots of things to do– I did make it to 4 of them. Almost 10 hours a day was devoted to the actual convention – getting there, being there, and getting back to the hotel. If you were in Denver, you could visit the many booths and tents that were set up, chat, eat, drink and listen to music. There were areas for MoveOn, Rock The Vote, CNN, MSNBC, and lots more, plus people handing out materials on the streets.

Wednesday was the day we voted. I proudly voted for Barack Obama, and had my picture taken while voting. It was an emotional time, and I was very proud to represent all the Democrats in Wisconsin's 1<sup>st</sup> Congressional District. The scene that night when the roll call was taken was amazing. When Hillary Clinton moved to elect Barack Obama by acclamation, we all were very moved. I'm just sorry Wisconsin's vote wasn't announced.

Thursday at Invesco Field was huge. The buses filled the parking lot – no cars were allowed. The lines to get through security were long and it was hot in the sun. We were seated on the field in a good location to see everything. After entertainers and speakers, Barack Obama spoke, followed by fireworks and confetti. It was a wonderful experience.

I've been to the Racine, Kenosha, and Walworth Dem meetings and the Rock County Labor Council meeting to tell them that I did what I was elected to do and to say thank you for the opportunity to attend such a historic event. It's an experience that I'll never forget."

Spotlight on Members continued.....

❖ **Don Piele**, a new ALL member was featured in the *Kenosha News* in January. "UW-Parkside Emeritus Professor of Mathematics Don Piele led the USA Computing Olympiad team at the 20<sup>th</sup> International Olympiad in Informatics (IOI).
