MESSAGE FROM JULIE.....

Every once in a while it is a good thing to take a look at how our Adventures in Lifelong Learning fits into a larger whole. You probably know that ALL is part of the Elderhostel Institute Network, a voluntary association of more than 200 Lifelong Learning Institutes all over the country with more than 100,000 members. LLIs for the most part operate out of universities and colleges and are completely independent in the kinds of programming they provide. In Wisconsin we have 11 such groups and ALL recently hosted a statewide conference to share ideas, and some Board members have attended regional meetings as well. We will be going to Schaumburg in August for another regional get together and we hope that we will be chosen to present a program there on our Week of Learning. Wisconsin groups are meeting in April to establish a statewide organization.

Here, we are with UW-Parkside, housed in the Center for Community Partnerships (CCP) which connects the campus and the community in many, many ways. In the 2006 Annual Report of the CCP, ALL was described in this way: "The Continuing Education seniors' organization (ALL) sponsored numerous campus events, organized ALL's Week of Learning (AWOL), a week-long study class of the Great Lakes, and developed dozens of lectures, classes and trips for its members. ALL's Education Study Group produced three workshops on the budget decisions of the Legislature and examined the effect of the budget reductions on the UW-system and UW-Parkside. Among the presenters were UW-System President Kevin Reilly, UW-Parkside Chancellor Jack Keating and UW Regent Chris Semanas."

So, while our board and committees work very hard to plan and implement excellent programs, lectures, classes, day trips, focus groups, and ethnic dining opportunities for our members, we are indeed affiliated with two great organizations – UW-Parkside and Elderhostel. And both are good partners.
