

WEB ARCHIVES OF CORE TITLES IN HISTORY AT THE LIBRARY

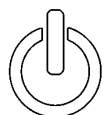
The Gerritsen Collection (the world's leading cross-cultural archive in women's history) delivers key retrospective books and periodicals in history, in cover-to cover full image with searchable ASCII text.

Dating from 1543 through 1945, the materials examine woman's relationship to her culture and historic period. They also reflect the lives of women in other countries, providing opportunities for cross-cultural comparisons. Titles include:

- *Address of Elizabeth Cady Stanton ...* Delivered at Seneca Falls and Rochester, N.Y.; an 1870 reprint of the 1848 lecture
- Jacob [James] Helfenstein, *The Social Position of Woman in Different Periods of History*, 1863
- Earle Cross, *The Hebrew Family*, 1927, a sociological study of marriage and the relative position of men and women in Hebrew society
- Helen Maria Winslow, *The Woman of To-morrow*, 1905. Winslow draws on the experiences of the 19th-century women's movement to forecast women's social position in the 20th century, reflecting the ambivalence of an era that witnessed changing attitudes towards women.
- Mary Mason, *The Young Housewife's Counsellor and Friend*, 1875, typical of late 19th-century literature counseling women on managing a household and caring for a family
- Annie S. Swan Smith, *As Others See Her: An Englishwoman's Impressions of the American Woman in War Time*, 1919, comparing American women's war work with that of Englishwomen during World War I
- Oliver Edward Janney, *The White Slave Traffic in America*, c. 1911. In its discussion of the moral, social, and economic factors underlying the sex industry, this book illustrates Americans' alarm at the spread of prostitution in the early 20th century.

Works are searchable by keyword, standard bibliographic elements, and Boolean operators, with records linked to corresponding page images in downloadable Adobe® PDF

Digitized from the masters in the UMI® microform vault, the Gerritsen Collection—Women's History Online is the most extensive international view of women in the public and private arena, spanning four centuries and 15 languages. Updated weekly, it will ultimately encompass more than 2 million pages from over 4,700 titles.
