

WEB ARCHIVES OF CORE PERIODICALS IN WOMEN'S HISTORY AT THE LIBRARY

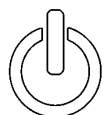
The Gerritsen Collection (the world's leading cross-cultural archive in women's history) delivers 265 key retrospective periodicals in cover-to-cover full image with searchable ASCII text. To enhance access, the articles are indexed in six document types—editorial cartoon, letter, obituary, poetry, recipe, and statistics.

Works date from 1543 through 1945. Titles include:

Works are searchable by keyword, standard bibliographic elements, and Boolean operators, with records linked to corresponding page images in downloadable Adobe® PDF

Digitized from the masters in the UMI® microform vault, the Gerritsen Collection—Women's History Online is the most extensive international view of women in the public and private arena, spanning four centuries and 15 languages. Updated weekly, it will ultimately encompass more than 2 million pages from over 4,700 titles.
