

SUMMER SCHOLARS Frequently Asked Questions

When is the Summer Scholar program offered?	Summer Scholars is a 4-week program that runs August 6 – September 1 st . The program is a full-day and night, residential program from Sunday night – Friday afternoon, students go home on the weekends.
What is the cost of Summer Scholars?	There is no monetary cost to you for your fees, housing, books, or meals. This is a value of over \$3,000 per student. In return, we do expect your full participation in all aspects of the Summer Scholars Program and continued participation throughout the academic year.
Who is eligible for the Summer Scholars program?	Summer Scholars is designed for new freshman.
How many students can participate in the Summer Scholar program?	We expect to select 25 students to participate in the Summer Scholar program for Summer 2017.
Do I have to live on-campus?	Yes, all students participating in Summer Scholars must live on-campus Sunday through Friday afternoon in order to participate in the scheduled activities of the program. Summer Scholars is designed as a full participation academic and residential program that will only benefit you if you spend a majority of your time with us. The only exceptions made will be for family emergencies or health reasons.
Do I live on-campus on the weekends?	No, students participating in Summer Scholars return home on Friday evening. The program resumes Sunday at 6:00pm each week.
When is check-in for Summer Scholars?	Summer Scholars are required to check-in for the program on Sunday, August 6, 2017 in Ranger Hall. 4135 University Dr., Kenosha, WI 53144.
What do I need to bring for my stay in Ranger Hall?	You will need to bring linens for your bed, a pillow, towels, toiletries, clothing, snacks, and any other personal items you may need throughout the week. No electronics or refrigerator provided in your room. The rooms are air conditioned.
What course is being offered for Summer Scholars?	Philosophy 101: Introduction to Philosophy. The following is the course description: An introduction to philosophical method and typical philosophical issues, such as the existence of God, life after death, freewill, the nature and sources of knowledge, and the nature of justice.
Will I receive college credit for the course that I take?	Yes. Upon successful completion you will receive 3 credits of academic credit for Summer Scholars, which will go towards your general education graduation requirement.
Is there a textbook for the course?	Yes. Your course materials will be provided and will be free of charge unless you fail to return the materials at the end of the summer program.
Can I bring a car to campus?	Yes, you may have a car on-campus.
Do I need to pay for parking?	No, the Summer Scholars program will provide you with a temporary parking pass during the program.
Can I work during Summer Scholars?	Maybe. As a participant in the Summer Scholar program you are required to live on-campus and attend all scheduled activities and events from 6:30pm – 9:00pm on Sunday's, 9:00am – 9:00pm Monday – Thursday, and 9:00am – 5:00pm on Friday. Students could potentially work on the weekends if their schedule permits.
Will there be any free time during the program?	Yes. There will be non-scheduled times when you will be able to leave Summer Scholars for a few hours. As the schedule may vary slightly each week, you will receive the schedule for the next week at the end of the previous week.
Can I have visitors?	Yes. Visitors are welcomed, but only during non-scheduled activity times.
Can visitors spend the night?	No. Visitors may not spend the night.
