

UW-Parkside Youth Options Program Application

Admissions Standards:

Students must be in the 11^{th} or 12^{th} grade of a Wisconsin public high school at the time of enrollment <u>and</u> must rank in the upper (top 25%) of their school class.

Process (for <u>every semester</u> the student wishes to enroll in Youth Options):

- Obtain UW-Parkside course information. Course and class time schedules are available on website at www.uwp.edu Keyword: course schedule
 *It is best to use the previous year's similar semester to determine which courses will likely be offered.
- 2. The student should obtain and complete the Wisconsin Department of Instruction Youth Options Plan and Report Form (P18700A). This form is available through your high school.
- 3. UW-Parkside limits Youth Options students to a maximum of two courses each semester at the discretion of the Youth Options advisor. However, applicants should have several alternative courses approved in the event that first choice course selections are closed at the time of registration.
- 4. Once courses have been approved by the student's high school counselor, obtain all necessary signatures and forward form P18700A, this application and an official high school transcript to:
