

CRIMINAL JUSTICE Transfer Guide

1. Transfer Policies

Students transferring from non-baccalaureate institutions to Parkside may generally transfer up to 72 credits earned at non-baccalaureate institutions toward the 120 credits required for degree completion. UW-Parkside may accept additional credits toward the degree where appropriate. A minimum of 15 credits numbered 300 or above must be completed at Parkside.

2. Major Requirements

To become a declared major, the student must have 1) completed CRMJ 101 with a grade of C or better, and 2) have an overall cumulative GPA of at least 2.25. The following requirements are in addition to the university general education requirements. Please use this guide in tandem with the Degree Requirements Transfer Guide.

GENERAL REFERENCE INFORMATION

APPLICATION PROCESS

Early application is recommended as Parkside operates on a rolling admission and reserves the right to stop accepting applications as needed. Students likely to be admitted will have a cumulative transfer GPA of 2.0 or better.

- Submit application fee*
- Submit an official copy of your high school transcript, Adult High School diploma, HSED or GED**
- Submit official transcripts from **ALL previous institutions** of higher education**

*Fee waivers are available for applicants with financial hardship; call (262) 595-2355 to request a waiver.

All transcripts **MUST BE OFFICIAL and come directly from the institution.

CALCULATION OF CUMULATIVE TRANSFER GPA

Parkside calculates GPA based on all transferrable courses from all institutions attended, including the course grade of (F). A cumulative GPA is not always the “current” GPA at. If a course is retaken, the most recent grade is calculated and transferred.

TUITION / SCHOLARSHIPS

A. Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP)

Illinois residents are charged 150% of the in-state tuition rate. All students are eligible; no additional application is needed.

2016-2017 Room/Board: \$7026* (annual) (*based on double-room and mid-level meal plan*)
