

## GENERAL REFERENCE TRANSFER GUIDE

### APPLICATION PROCESS

Early application is recommended as Parkside operates on a rolling admission and reserves the right to stop accepting applications as needed. Students likely to be admitted will have a cumulative transfer GPA of 2.0 or better.

- Complete an online application at <http://apply.wisconsin.edu>
- Submit application fee\*
- Submit an official copy of your high school transcript, Adult High School diploma, HSED or GED\*\*
- Submit official transcripts from **ALL previous institutions** of higher education\*\*

\*Fee waivers are available for applicants with financial hardship; call (262) 595-2355 to request a waiver.

\*\*All transcripts **MUST BE OFFICIAL** and come directly from the institution.

**STUDENT TRANSFER ASSESSMENT REPORT (S.T.A.R):** S.T.A.R is designed to reveal how Parkside will award credit for transferable courses. Find S.T.A.R online at <https://uwp.edu/apply/admissions/transfer/star.cfm>.

**CALCULATION OF CUMULATIVE TRANSFER GPA:** Based on *transferrable courses* from all institutions attended, including grades of (F). If a course is retaken, the most recent grade is calculated and transferred.

### TUITION / SCHOLARSHIPS

#### A. Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP)

All undergraduate students from Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota in an eligible degree seeking program qualify for the Midwest Student Exchange Scholarship Program (MSEP) tuition rate, which is equivalent to 150% of the resident rate. New first-time students can qualify for one of our Midwest Scholarships. Each scholarship is prorated, based on the number of credits the student is enrolled in.

# UNIVERSITY DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Students who earn an Associate in Arts (A.A.) or Science (A.S.) degree, with at least 45 transferable credits, from an accredited college parallel liberal arts program will be considered to **have completed the general education and skills (English and math) requirements\* for degree completion**. Students must still satisfy the ethnic diversity and foreign language requirements. This guide can be used to help students who are not completing a degree program choose courses which will transfer to Parkside and apply towards degree progress.

*\*Additional English and/or math may be required if the major has advanced courses required in either discipline.*

*Every effort is made to maintain accurate information; however, this information is subject to change. It is always best to check with your academic advisor or a Parkside transfer admissions counselor to ensure accuracy of equivalencies in your transfer plan. ## FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

- complete course at 104 level or above at Parkside (or equivalent)
- 2 college semesters of one foreign language from an accredited institution
