## Parkside Makes a Difference

At the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, we make a difference. That's not just a statement; it's a reflection of our commitment and our actions. Our dedication to delivering high-value, impactful experiences is evident across all facets of our university. Our programs and services provide practical, realworld experiences with meaningful real-world outcomes. From our Theatre Arts professional training company model, to our Sales Center Lab in our Innovation Corridor, to our competencybased accredited Business programs, to our Applied Health Science Programs, where our students achieve an impressive 89.9% medical school acceptance rate—more than double the national average. Just this past August in Forbes, Parkside was highlighted for its collaborative work with Higher Expectations for Racine County, as an example of a place where colleges, companies, and communities are working together to improve higher education outcomes. Outcomes, particularly for those who have been left on the sidelines for far too long.

## **Parkside is Distinctive**

At Parkside, we are proud to serve the highest percentage of low-income and first-generation college students among the Universities of Wisconsin. Our commitment to accessibility and inclusivity is evident in the 38% of our students who receive

Pell Grants, far surpassing the 23% average across the system. We also enroll the second-highest percentage of first-generation students, with 47% of our students being the first in their families to attend college. Our commitment to underrepresented students is equally strong, with over 31% of our students coming from diverse cultural and ethnic backgrounds.

At Parkside, we are a part of the fabric of our community. A remarkable 62% of our students are from the counties of Kenosha, Racine, and Walworth. An incredible 95% of our students are from the Milwaukee-Chicago corridor, and over 89% of our alumni live in Wisconsin and Illinois. It could not be more clear, our students enroll from here, they live here, and they stay to work here. This connection to our region is a cornerstone of our identity and our mission. Parkside is firmly rooted (tree pun intended) in the Milwaukee-Chicago corridor.

Seriously, the Milwaukee-Chicago corridor represents a vital and economically important region. This corridor, where we are meeting today, is significant due to its dynamic economic activity, with both Milwaukee and Chicago serving as major hubs driving a diverse mix of industries and economic activity. This corridor is well-connected by major transportation routes, and recent urban development and revitalization efforts have further enhanced connectivity and appeal, making it a key area for business growth and regional synergy.

## **Forward Focus**

Within this active region, Parkside is at a pivotal moment of transformation and forward focus. Our goal is clear: to build a sustainable, vibrant future for Parkside that will serve our community and our students for decades to come. We have a distinctive region to serve and a foundation of engagement, partnership, and community that support our pursuit of three strategic directions with a forward focus:
