He teaches Ancient Greek and Latin as well as courses on the history, literature, and culture of ancient Greece and Rome.

He received his Ph.D. from Columbia University, and has twice been selected as an NEH Summer Scholar. In 2014-2015 he held a fellowship at the University of Connecticut's

Humanities Institute. In addition to a translation of Guibert of Nogent's *Monodies* (Penguin 2011), his publications include articles in the *Oxford Encyclopedia of Ancient Greece & Rome*, the *Classical Journal*, and *The Journal of Medieval Latin*, and he is working on two volumes for the Loeb Classical Library (Harvard University Press).
