As mentioned elsewhere in the APB, class registration, as of April, will be \$10 per class. We do pay presenters \$100 per class.

PLEASE NOTE: The university parking shuttles are no longer running, and there is no plan at this time to resume offering that service to students or guests on campus.

Due to the parking situation on campus and a lack of a shuttle option, it is our plan to offer most classes in rooms at Tallent Hall where there is ample parking near the

entrance. During times the campus is not in full session we may occasionally use rooms in the main buildings.

The rooms at Tallent Hall are smaller in size so there will be a 30 capacity limit for in-person attendance. Virtual enrollment is unlimited. At the time you are registering for a hybrid option class you will be given a choice for inperson or virtual. Once in-person room capacities are reached all enrollment after will be automatically virtual. There will be **no inperson walk-ins allowed**.
