MESSAGE FROM THE ALL PRESIDENT:

I became ALL President in July, 2021. These are some events that followed:

- September, 2021 The Delta variant became the dominant COVID strain worldwide.
- December, 2021 The Omicron variant was first detected in the U.S.
- January, 2022 President Biden announced a plan to give free at-home COVID tests and N-95 masks.
- March, 2022 The FDA approved a second COVID booster for older persons.
- May, 2022 U.S. COVID deaths exceeded one million.
- November, 2022 The CDC warned of a rough winter with flu, RSV, and COVID.

Throughout this time, our hard-working ALL volunteers and our program assistant, Vanessa, continued to develop a rich array of educational experiences for our membership. They pivoted and quickly developed new skills for virtual and hybrid offerings, and during that time, they also learned that continuation of those options into the future had value for our members whose schedules and mobility status presented access challenges. And then, as soon as it became safe to do so, our volunteers and Vanessa created in person activities once again, helping our members to emerge from their homes and renew and create valuable relationships while engaging in educational adventures. As I transition to the role of ALL Immediate Past President, I look forward to bright days ahead under the leadership of our new President, Shelly Underhill, as we all do our parts by signing up for activities and by volunteering to support the sustainability of our community treasure, Adventures in Lifelong Learning.

Karen Kempinen ALL Immediate Past President presentations covering a wide range of topics this year. We recently had an update on Turkey, "went" to the coronation, heard about the status of the Great Lakes, and learned some history and got a preview of what we would see if we went a bit north up to Door County and paid a visit to the Ridges Sanctuary in Baileys Harbor. And artistic members learned about the alcohol ink painting technique.

In the next quarter we have scheduled a class on the impact of book censorship on communities, will be given some historical background on the lead up to the Russia/Ukraine conflict with an opportunity to ask questions of the presenter who is a political scientist and native of Russia, and have a class on the music of the Eagles to complement a planned trip to a performance of their music. We are also hoping to soon offer a class on another "hot" topic, artificial intelligence.

While the majority of our classes are provided by in-person presenters we still seek out subjects of interest that may best be done in an on-line format due to the location of some of the highly qualified presenters that are not available to us in-person.

PLEASE NOTE: The university parking shuttles are no longer running, and there is no plan at this time to resume offering that service to students or guests on campus.

Due to the parking situation on campus and a lack of a shuttle option, it is our plan to offer most classes in rooms at Tallent Hall where there is ample parking near the entrance. During times the campus is not in full session we may occasionally use rooms in the main buildings.

The rooms at Tallent Hall are smaller in size so there will be a 40 capacity limit for in-person attendance. Virtual enrollment is unlimited. At the time you are registering for a hybrid option class you will be given a choice for inperson or virtual. Once in-person room capacities are reached all enrollment after will be automatically virtual. There will be **no in-person walk-ins allowed**.

In-person attendees will be asked to silence any phones and also asked to refrain from talking to each other once Vanessa has turned on the microphone in the classroom. Any noises and conversations in the classroom are picked up by the microphones in the ceiling of the rooms and then become annoying background noise for those listening in virtually and the conversations are broadcast to those listening on line.
