"Hand building" is working with clay by hand using only simple tools, not a pottery wheel. From ancient times, artists and craftsmen have been creating beautiful pots and clay forms using just clay, their hands and fingers, and basic hand tools. In these two classes, we'll explore some common methods for creating hand built pots including pinching, coiling and/or combining flat slab techniques. And at the end of the class, you'll take your small ceramic piece home to treasure forever!

Our instructor, Professor Lisa Marie Barber, explains that her own clay works consist of physical and conceptual layers, working together to describe life as something positive, elusive, playful, sentimental, and profound. Many of her compositions use imagery from city life, influenced by Mexican folk art and altars, reflecting her Mexican-American heritage.
