How Many Chimneys?



Join us for a day trip to nearby Genesee Depot to experience historic Ten Chimneys (just two of which are shown in the photo, left) – the estate of Broadway stars Alfred Lunt and Lynn Fontanne, which is now a National Historic Landmark.

The tour of their home, studio, cottage, and grounds is limited to small-group docent-guided tours of the intimate spaces and peaceful views that brought the

couple back to Wisconsin again and again for over half a century. The visit also includes a stop in the Lunt-Fontanne Program Center, with a small museum of the life and times of the couple's heyday 1920s-1950s, and the Design for Living Museum Store. After the tour, we will dine at the historic Union House in "downtown" Genesee Depot.



Note: there will be stairs and outdoor walking on uneven ground as part of the tour, so wear comfortable shoes and clothing appropriate for indoor-outdoor October weather in Wisconsin.

Genesee Depot was founded to take advantage of the Milwaukee and Mississippi Railroad, acting as an agricultural service center for the area. A grain elevator, woolen factory, general store, blacksmith shop, and post office were the main components of the local economy. While most of these local landmarks have succumbed to the ravages of time, the Union House survives as a tangible link to the community's past.

The **Union House** has been a prominent part of Genesee Depot since 1861, when a 35-year-old Irish immigrant, Patrick Lynch, opened its doors. Built in the fashionable Greek Revival style, it was the largest public building in Genesee Depot, and boasted a second story ballroom.
