10:30 to 12:30 The Kenosha History Center : 220 51st Place

Collects and preserves artifacts, records and information vital to understanding the history of the county's social, cultural, ethnic and industrial heritage since its settlement. The Rambler Legacy Gallery is dedicated to tell the story of Kenosha County after the turn of the century. Auto manufacturing became big business and this is the focus of the Gallery.

The Southport Light Station Museum: 5117 4th Ave.

The Museum is composed of the 1866 historic lighthouse and the adjacent 1867 historic Lighthouse Keepers Home. Both floors of the home have been restored to a 1908 time period. It focuses on the shipping industry, fishing, lighthouse keepers and the life saving station.

2:30 Electric Streetcar Circulator: [Trolley] 8th Ave. and 54th St.
