

Colleagues,


Currently, a curfew of 7:00 p.m. is in effect for Kenosha County through Sunday evening. We cannot predict what conditions will be next week when school begins but are concerned that, were the curfew to be continued, we would put our students from Kenosha at risk by maintaining our evening course schedule for in-person classes. There are 53 class sections that are meeting face-to-face, and that end later than 6:45 p.m. You are receiving this note because you are teaching at least one of them.

We know how much preparation you've already had to make to get ready for the beginning of the semester, but we need to ask you at this point to prepare for the possibility that we will ask that you begin the semester for your evening classes by converting them to remote delivery, at least for the first week or two while we reassess the situation. We don't believe we need to make this decision yet and hope it will not be necessary but wanted to let you know our current thinking.
