	To help instructors overcome these challenges, the General Education Program, with the support of the HIPs Leadership Team, is planning on holding a summer workshop on using high-impact practices in Gen Ed courses starting in the summer of 2021. The workshop will feature presentations on how to pragmatically integrate an array of high-impact practices into introductory courses. Parkside faculty and staff who are experienced practitioners of these HIPs will deliver the presentations, supplemented by outside experts as necessary. Workshop participants will be given time during the workshop to develop ideas on how to integrate more HIPs into their courses and will be required to add new HIPs to their course or expand their existing use of HIPs the next time they teach a Gen Ed course. Participants will receive \$1000 for participating in the workshop and an additional \$500 on certifying that they have added or expanded their use of HIPs. The workshop is open to both faculty and instructional staff.
