Pay Plan/Governor Evers Lawsuit

UW President sent out email through University Relations about the lawsuit. We've fallen to 42nd nationally for public university funding. All chancellors also sent an email on how to contact your legislators.

Shared Governance Update

Joint session first. ATP timeline has been extended, BOR approved. Rothman said to fight the tendency to add more to the ATP project. US staff will change to calendar year from fiscal year. Changes in life insurance, probably consolidation, more communication in the next couple weeks. According to Rothman, he believes since it was signed into law, it's illegal for JCOER to withhold the raises. Rothman "believes in DEI and that it speaks to student success." Talk about dual-enrollment with high schools, mild concern about lost tuition revenue. Talk about automatic admissions for Wisconsin high schoolers. Legislative rep is not sure what Vos actually wants. Told "if you're going to send a letter to your legislators, make it personal."

Individual school updates: Seeing a lot more student engagement on many of the campuses. Superior celebrates First Generation students and they're getting an Esports team. Plattville layoffs: 31 permanent positions cut, 30 VSIP. Oshkosh layoffs: Listening sessions were well received. La Cross switched to Okta last week. Green Bay has a structural deficit, some layoffs, and everyone over \$100,000 had to take furlough. Whitewater passed joint resolution to gather employee comment on the pay plan and sent it to their chancellor for talking points.

Faculty Senate Update

Met in October. Voted on University Committee chair having a longer term- from 1 year to 3 years. Voted to eliminate some minors. Want to offer an Anthropology major degree. Created a minor in dance and certificates in project management, IT operations, and IT leadership.
