Up to thirty Parkside Faculty and Instructional Academic Staff may participate in this pilot project which is composed of fully online modules. There are five areas of study; Designing an Effective Course and Class, Establishing a Productive Learning Environment, Using Active Learning Techniques, Promoting Higher Order Thinking, and Assessing to Inform Instruction and Promote Learning.
