Academic integrity can be difficult to determine in the digital domain. Technological solutions have been developed to try to improve accountability and integrity of the assessment process. At this session you will be invited to learn about three such tools. Parkside, through UW-System licensing, already has a plagiarism detection tool. Its use can be in a manner that provides the instructor with reports regarding the level of possible infractions or it can also be utilized in a manner such that students are responsible for identifying for themselves, prior to assignment submission, the quality of their work.

Other tools address the integrity of the test-taking process. Two such tools are in use across UW-System and have already been integrated into the new Canvas LMS. They are Respondus and Examity. The features of these tools will be presented and discussed. We will ask for your input as to which product would be the best fit for Parkside to adopt.
