

Math Education: A Comparative Perspective

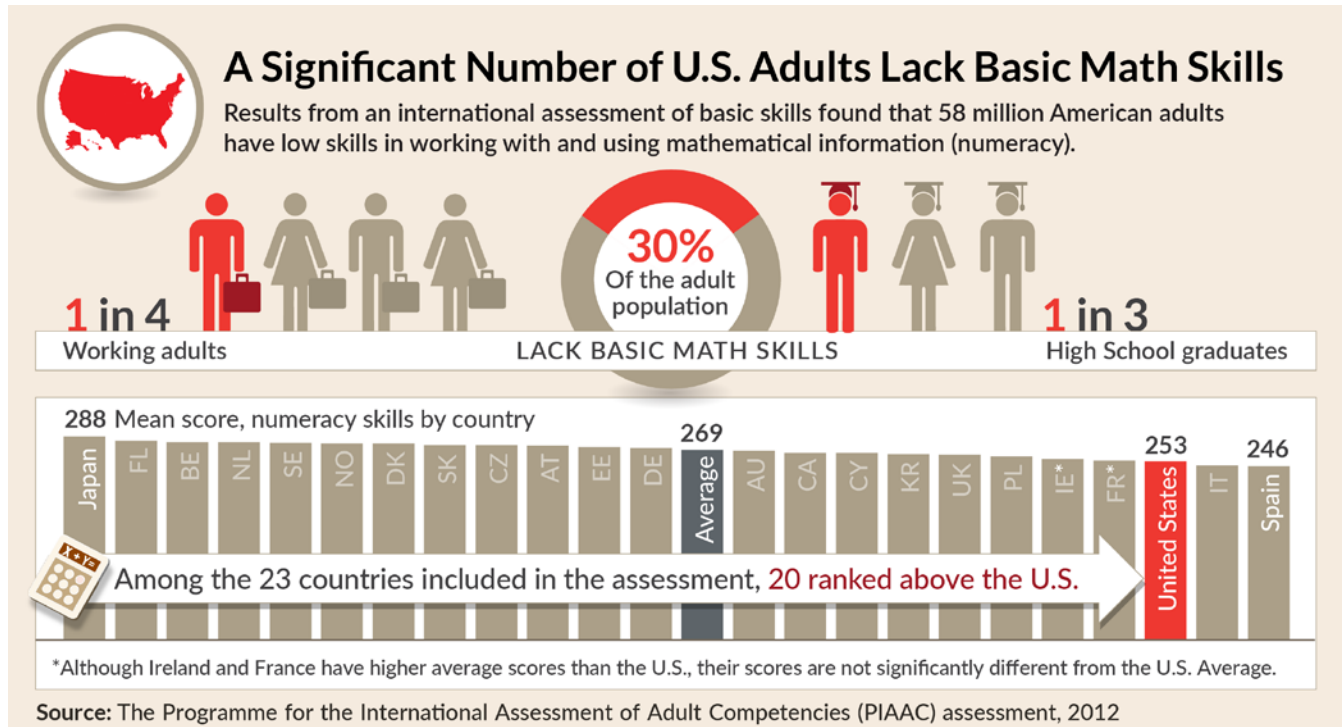

It was reported by the Nation’s Report Card that “only 39 percent of fourth graders, 34 percent of eighth-graders, and 23 percent of twelfth-graders score at or above the ‘proficient’ level in mathematics. In colleges, demand for remedial math education is high”.
