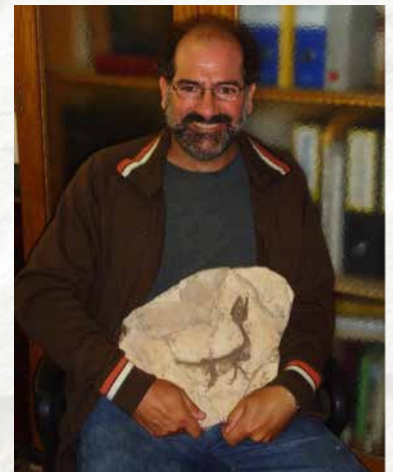

## DR. LUIS CHIAPPE | BIRDS OF STONE: AVIAN FOSSILS FROM THE AGE OF DINOSAURS

*Dr. Chiappe, Director of the Dinosaur Institute at the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County, is a leading expert on early bird evolution.*

How did the modern bird body plan evolve? Many features commonly associated with birds (feathers, wings, wishbones) were inherited from their dinosaurian ancestors, while others made their debut through the birds' long Mesozoic history. New fossils have laid out this evolutionary saga in great detail, tracing the changes from Archaeopteryx to the dawn of modern Aves.
