Dr. Gary Wood will explain how to determine the autoignition temperature of paper here and now.

Can a machine track by scent?

Dr. Lori Allen will explore science's progress in developing an "electronic nose"—how devices can identify an unknown substance.

Can someone memorize a whole book?

Dr. Ed Bowden will consider human memory and whether it has the capacity to memorize entire volumes.
