## Required to move to Residency / Student Teaching semester:

- Successful completion the following coursework: all degree, major/minor courses, EDU requirements except 420 & 425
- Cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher AND EDU major GPA of 3.0 or higher, with all EDU course grades C+ or above
- Successful completion of the Content Knowledge Assessment
- Successful completion of the Pre-Residency Portfolio with a score of 20 or higher
- Passed criminal background check within the last two years that will remain valid through Residency
- Admitted to Residency

## Required for endorsement of licensure:

- Successful completion of all licensure requirements for initial license, including the Pedagogical Knowledge Assessment (see your Major)
- Meet the Content Knowledge Assessment Policy requirements (see below)

## **Content Knowledge Assessment**
