Content Knowledge

All candidates are required to successfully complete a Content Knowledge Assessment prior to admission to Residency by meeting **one** of the following:

Assessment	Required Score/Grade
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1	Praxis Subject	English: Pass Praxis English Language Arts: Content Knowledge (5038) with score of 167 Math: Pass Praxis Mathematics (5165) with score of 159 Social Studies: Pass Praxis Social Studies: Studies Content Knowledge (5581) with score of 153
2	Coursework (Alternative)	Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale in the required content minor or major

Pedagogical Knowledge Assessment

Candidates are required to complete and pass an assessment of pedagogical knowledge prior to being endorsed for licensure. At UW-Parkside, this assessment includes successful completion of the Pre-Residency Portfolio and evaluations of real-time teaching during Residency.
