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# **Parkside Access to College Credit**

# **High School Faculty Qualifications**

High school faculty who receive University of Wisconsin-Parkside (PACC office and academic department) approval are recognized as PACC faculty. Through the PACC program, high school faculty teach UW-Parkside college courses at a partner high school for high school and college credit.

### **Qualification Requirements**

High school faculty who teach UW-Parkside courses in high schools must:

- a) Have at a minimum of a master's degree in the discipline in which the course is offered.
- b) Have at least the minimum qualifications required by the academic department responsible for the course.
- c) Meet all credentialing guidelines and standards that UW-Parkside is required to follow for accreditation.
- d) Be approved as a qualified instructor by the department chair (or designee) and dean.

### **Professional Development/Collaboration**

High school faculty who teach UW-Parkside courses in high school must:

- a) Be willing to participate in an annual meeting with the university and faculty liaison, typically held during the summer.
- b) Work cooperatively with faculty liaisons to implement courses including syllabi, assessment, course evaluations, and set up on-site visits.
- c) Uphold UW-Parkside policies and procedures in the high school classroom during PACC courses.
- d) Willing to conduct on-site visits to the university to observe teaching methods in the university classroom.

#### **Assessment**

High school faculty who teach UW-Parkside courses in high School must:

- a) Follow the content and learning outcome guidelines as identified in the UW-Parkside syllabus ensuring that high school students are held to the same standards of achievement as those expected of students attending on-campus sections.
- b) Submit grades within 48 hours of the end of the course on SOLAR.
- c) Administer the UW-Parkside course evaluation to all PACC students.
- d) Participate in any instructor or program survey's intended to assess the PACC program.
