About 1848 the first German Protestants came to Kenosha. But slowly they increased. Their religious conscience found no expression yet in public worship, as at that time there were only very few Lutheran ministers in Wisconsin. Perhaps, the better ones would have joined English denominations, if they had better understood the English language.

Since 1850, the Lutheran minister at Racine, Rev. Mr. Weinmann, visited Kenosha and gathered the few German Protestants for services. At the same time some families separated, organizing themselves for a German Methodist congregation. But the Lutherans, who became more numerous by and by, remained like a scattered flock without any shepherd.

In the spring of 1854, the German Catholic priest here, Rev. D. Huber, who a short time be-

fore, with liberal sentiments, had emigrated from Switzerland, turned to Protestantism and particularly to the Lutheran church, and organized at Kenosha the first German Lutheran congregation. Under his care and with him it joined the Synod of Wisconsin. He labored under difficulties in patience for two years. He had not only to struggle with cares for sustenance, but also experienced odious obstacles from Catholics, and even intrigues from the midst of his own congregation. Therefore he resolved in the spring of 1856 upon accepting a call to New Berlin. For three months the small congregation was without a minister again, during which time the Rev. Mr. Conrad, from Racine, sometimes preached and administered the sacrament for them, until the Synod sent the Rev. C. Starck to Kenosha, and the congregation, after his first sermon, unanimously elected him for their pastor. Though a little out-parish in the town of Paris of about a dozen families is united with it, he would not have been able to subsist with his small salary, (\$200,) had not a part of the Anglo-Americans in town liberally aided in supporting him. Through him the congregation obtained a constitution, in which it is placed upon the basis of the Augburg confession. Under him they also succeeded in gaining a lot for a church, in the North Ward, near the German Catholic Church, and if the pastor's collections within and out of the city are blessed—that, alas, was interrupted by the panic—the congregation is to erect this year a small plain church edifice. The services are still held in the North Ward school house, and the number of their visitors is fifty. The exterior order, which, this side of the ocean, is without the influence of the state government, is difficult to maintain the Germans, because

they never were accustomed before to provide for themselves—becomes more and more settled, and corresponding to sound christian principles. Of enlargement of the congregation much cannot be said, for the most of the German Protestant emigrants prefer Racine. It has at present (in the beginning of 1858,) about forty communicating members, though it could have at least eighty, if infidelity and indifference did not prevent from church and services the majority of the nominal Protestants. These call themselves Protestants too, but against *what* do they protest? they present themselves to their Anglo-American fellow citizens as "Lutherans," but have of Lutheranism nothing more than the name. They pervert, alas, the benefits of freedom of *faith* in this country, into the pernicious freedom of *infidelity!*

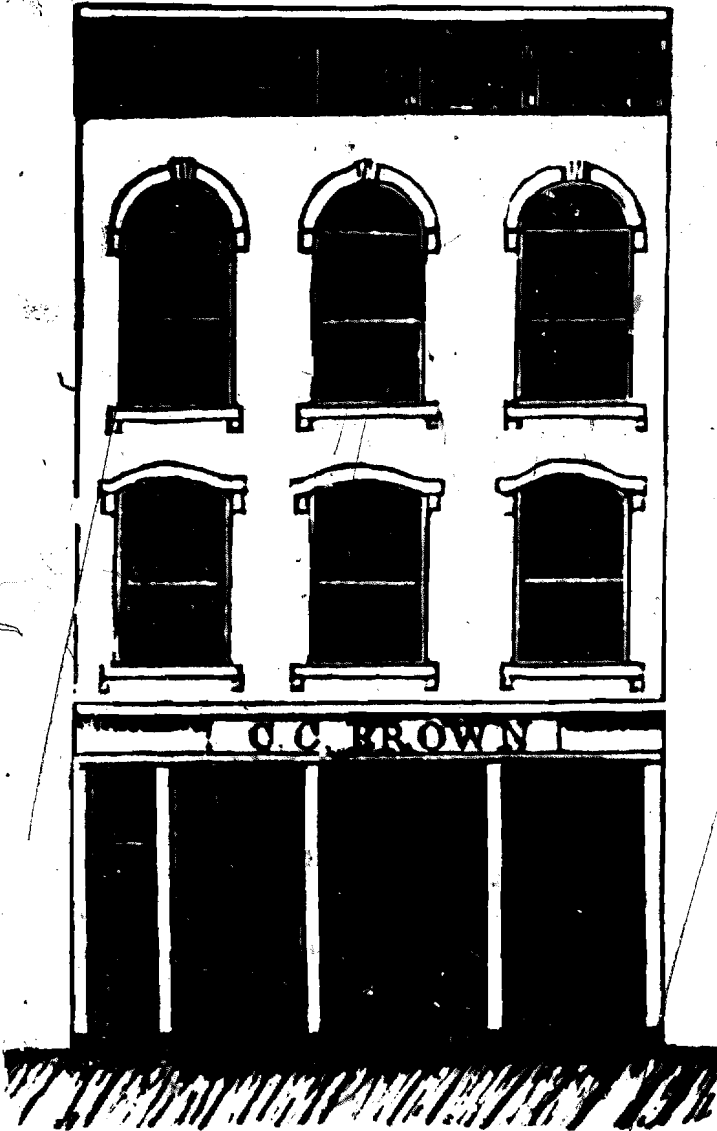
